The qualifiers for KO Stage-3 finalized

In the 9th **Mohan Lal Bhartia Memorial Grand Prix Bridge Champion**, the last two rounds of the Swiss league of Team of Four event were played yesterday morning and the TOP 16 teams qualified for the knock-out stage.

It was a really tough competition in the last 2 rounds, but yesterday's leaders after 6 rounds **ARUN JAIN (ARUN JAIN, S SARKAR, P BARDHAN, B DAS, A SADHU, P S MUKHERJEE)** were able to retain their top position with a score of **115.24 VPs**. **SHRI RADHEY (V M LAL, P R BAFANA, R SRIDHAR, ASHOK VAIDYA)** did well to jump from yesterday's 6th position to 2nd position scoring 107.16 VPs. **DHAMPUR SUGAR MILLS** (Ashok Goel, K.R. Venkatraman, Sumit Mukherjee, P. Sridhar, S. Sunderram) who were second yesterday with **87.46 VPs** did not have good sessions today and finally finished at 9th place with a score of 98.69 VPs.

RAMPAGE (104.78 VPs), PIRATES (101.75), DR. SANGHI (101.02 VPs), PODDAR HOUSING (100.62 VPs), KAMLESH GUPTA (100.57 VPs) and PANKAJ MEHTA (98.98 VPs) finished the Swiss league in the 3rd to 8th rank. The 9th to 16th places were taken by Dhampur Sugar Mills, Formidables, COOKXON, Shree Cement, Anoop Dhawan, Spartans, Alpha & KOSMOS. The complete rankings after 8 rounds are given on **Page 4**.

A total of 44 non-qualifying teams played a 2-session (18 boards per session) Board-a-Match event in the afternoon. The teams were divided into 4 sections of 11 teams. The event was won by Team "JAY JAGANNATH" of Orissa, with an excellent score of 23.50 Match Point out of a maximum of 36 (around 65%). INDIA GLYCOLS team with a score of 23.00 were 2nd and there was a tie between COLONELS Team & K2 Bangalore teams (yet to be broken by the directors) for the 3rd / 4th place with a score of 22.50. **See complete results on Page 4.**

In the 1st of the 5-stage KO matches (2 sessions of 10 boards), the 4 losers of the matches on Table 5 to 8 (Lower Half) got eliminated. DHAMPUR SUGAR MILLS (#9) beat SPARTAN (#16) by 61-38; SHREE CEMENT (#10) beat KOSMOS (#15) by 55-42; FORMIDABLES (#11) beat COOKXON (#14) by 65-18, the losers surrendering after the 1st set and ALPHA (##12) beat ANOOP DHAWAN (#13) by 46-25 to go through to the stage-2 of the knock-out. In the UPPER HALF, ARUN JAIN (#1) beat KAMLESH GUPTA (#8) by 68-34; PODDAR HOUSING (#2) beat PIRATES (#7) by 47-33; SHRI RADHEY (#3) lost to RAMPAGE (#6) by 30-39 and PANKAJ MEHTA (#4) lost to DR. SANGHI (#5) by 62-73.

In the stage-2 matches of the knock-out (2 Sessions of 10 boards), on Table # 1 & 2 (the TOP bracket), ARUN JAIN beat Dr. SANGHI's team by 62-55 in a hard fought match, whereas after a nail biting clash, RAMPAGE tied with PODDAR HOUSING by 47-47. The 2 board match to break the tie was won by RAMPAGE by 7 IMPs.

In the lower half of stage-2 matches, Pankaj Mehta lost to Kamlesh Gupta by 41-60; Shri Radhey beat Pirates in a tight contest by 25-17; DHAMPUR SUGAR MILLS beat ALPHA by 53-44 in a well contested match and Shree Cement lost to Formidables by 39-63.

The line-up for KO-3 to be played today morning is – UPPER HALF - TBL-1: ARUN JAIN (#1) Vs. RAMPAGE (#2); LOWER HALF - TBL-2: PODDAR HOUSING (#3) Vs. FORMIDABLES (#8); TBL-3: DR. SANGHI (#4) Vs. DHAMPUR SUGAR MILLS (#7) and TBL-4: KAMLESH GUPTA (#5) Vs. SHRI RADHEY (#6).

The winner of TBL-1 goes directly to final and loser of TBL-1 plays with winner of TBL-4, whereas Winner of TBL-2 plays with winner of TBL-3. Losers of TBL-2 to TBL-4 will be joint 6th to 8th. In KO-4, losers of TBL-1 & TBL-2 will be joint 4th & 5th and winners will play KO-5 for a place in finals.

Today the 3-session Match Point Open Pair event starts. More than 100 Pairs are expected to participate.

North opened 1H and over East's double, South bid a nice strategic 2H rather than passing. This prompted North to bid 4H with his good hand, which became the final contract. East led the DK, declarer won in hand with DA and led a club to dummy's CK for a heart finesse, which lost to East. East cashed his DQ and could have defeated the contract by leading a low spade to partner's King and getting the all important diamond ruff. However, he instead played SA and that was the end of the defense.

This was a deal of Pointed Suit Vs. Rounded Suits. At one table over 1D, South bid 2NT, which showed Hearts & Clubs. This prompted North to bid a preemptive 4H, which was passed. Declarer had no problem in making the contract losing 2 clubs & a spade.

In the other room, South overcalled 1H over 1D and West was allowed to show his 4-carder spades.

Though North tried pre-emption by bidding 3H but East with his good hand and 4-carder spade bid 4S, which is always makes 11 tricks after heart lead, thus allowing for a double swing on the board.

West opened a strong club and East bid 2C, showing 9+ hand with 5-carder clubs, Once East bid 4NT quantitative over partner's 2NT, West had no hesitation in raising to slam with his 19 HCP hand. North on lead solved all the problems of declarer by leading a spade allowing 12 tricks. But without spade lead also, declarer can play his top 5 clubs, 2 diamonds & 2 hearts and South is in problem. He has to keep 3-carder spade and a heart. Declarer can play a heart to South, who is forced to open the spades.

Playing Standard, North-South reached an excellent 4H contract on a 4-3 fit. West led C2 and East played the Jack, when a low club was played from dummy. The club return was ruffed in hand and HT successfully finessed. Another heart to Ace was played and a low diamond to King played and diamond returned. If West ruffs, that would have been the end of defense, but he discarded a club and the defense prevailed in downing the contract.

There was no problem in reaching the nice slam. However few tables bid and made 7S on correct guess of Clubs. In 7S, declarer takes out the trumps in four rounds and then cashes his top diamonds.

Now he plays a heart to Ace, ruffs a diamond, plays another heart to King and ruffs a heart. Now the 9-cards of North are known and hence hoping for a 4-card club with North, declarer took the finesse from North's side to claim his contract.

The East bidding showed a distributional hand, but with not too many values. When West corrected 3H to 3S, East bid 4S, which became the final contract. There was no play and there were easy 12 tricks for the taking.

At other table, over 2NT for minors, West bid 3D showing good hand with spade fit. Now when East bid 3H, West did well by bidding 4D and then there was no stopping to the slam.

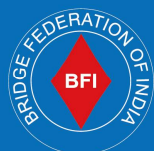
